This revised Policy incorporates an increase in charges from 50p to £1 per trip, maximum weekly charges, an update on the concessionary travel pass which can now be used nationwide, information on the Blue Badge Scheme, criteria for the single occupancy use of taxis or other LA provided transport and an Eligibility Quick Practice Guide as Appendix 3 which professionals may detach and take with them on visits.
