POLICE REPRESENTATION

The Prevention of Children from Harm

Proof of Age/Challenge 21

The licence holder shall ensure that anyone who appears to be under 21 years of age who is consuming alcohol or attempting to purchase alcohol will be asked to prove their age. Accepted methods of proof of age are: passports, photo driving licences and PASS accredited proof of age cards e.g. Validate, Connexions, Citizen Card, Prove It Card. If any such person fails to satisfy the licence holder by means of such proof of age that they are 18 years old or older that person shall be ejected from the premises forthwith. A notice or notices shall be displayed in and at the entrance to the premises where they can be clearly seen and read and shall indicate that it is unlawful for persons under 18 to purchase alcohol or for any person to purchase alcohol on behalf of a person under 18 years of age.

To Prevent Public Nuisance

Cheshire Police have adopted the ACPO recommendations in relation to unspecified events. The exact wording of this is as follows

No more than 12 extensions per premises per year (excluding applications made under TENS) should be allowed

An operating plan covering the additional measures that will be taken to manage crime and disorder on these occasions to be completed.

A minimum of 7 days notice to the Police and the Licensing Authority

An absolute veto for the Police in respect of any of these occasions

To prevent crime and disorder

Open containers.

No drink shall be removed from the premises in an unsealed container

Pubwatch

The licence holder and/or the designated premises supervisor or a person nominated by them shall be a member of and regularly attend at meetings of the Pub and Club watch scheme for the area within the premises listed.
