1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

To assist the Members of the Regulatory Sub-Committee in their consideration of two applications made by Lorraine Ashton for the Blundells Arms, Hale Road, Widnes.

The first application is for the Transfer of the Premises Licence for the Blundell Arms, Hale Road, Widnes.

The second application is to Vary the Designated Premises Supervisor at the Blundell Arms, Hale Road, Widnes.

2. **RECOMMENDATION** that

The Sub-Committee considers the contents of the report and makes a determination on the two applications.

3. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 3.1 An application has been made by Ms Lorraine Ashton to transfer the Premises Licence Holder and to Vary the Designated Premises Supervisor at the Blundell Arms, Hale Road, Widnes. The applications are two separate applications for the premises and each application has to be treated separately. Each application has been explained separately in the report.
- 3.2 An application has been made under Section 42 of the Licensing Act 2003 for the transfer of a Premises Licence in relation to the Blundell Arms, Hale Road, Widnes on the 8 June 2025.

- 3.3 An application was then submitted by Lorraine Ashton under Section 37 of the Licensing Act 2003 to Vary the Designated Premises Supervisor into Lorraine Ashtons name for the Blundell Arms, Hale Road, Widnes on the 10th June 2025.
- 3.4 The premises has held a licence since the 8th November 2021, there has been a previous licence in place at this premises since the 24th November 2005 until the 8 June 2021.

4. THE APPLICATION

- 4.1 An application was submitted to transfer the premises licence holder from the current licence holder (Cheshire Retail NW Ltd) to Lorraine Ashton. A copy of the application can be found at **Appendix A** of this report.
- 4.2 The application to transfer the premises licence was received on the 8 June 2025 and, the last date for representations was the 22nd June 2025.
- 4.3 The application has been made in an individual name, and officers can confirm that all the requirements for the Right to Work in the UK have been met. The current licence holder has consented to the transfer.
- 4.4 An application was subsequently submitted by Ms Lorraine Ashton to Vary the Designated Premises Supervisor to Lorraine Ashton. A copy of the application can be found at **Appendix B** of this report.
- 4.5 The application to Vary the Designated Premises Supervisor was received on the 10th June and, the last date for representations was the 24th June 2025.
- 4.6 The current Designated Premises Supervisor at the Blundell Arms is Steven Hewitt.
- 4.7 Under the Licensing Act 2003, the Premises Licence Holder must apply to vary the Designated Premises Supervisor at a licensed premises. Ms Ashton submitted the relevant documentation to transfer the premises licence first, then subsequently submitted an application to Vary the Designated Premises Licence Holder into her name. The correct procedure has been followed.
- 4.8 Attached for completeness at **Appendix C** of this report, is a copy of the licence for the Blundell Arms which includes the conditions attached to the licence.

5. REQUIREMENT FOR A HEARING

- 5.1 The above applications are normally straight forward and dealt with as an administrative matter. As part of the application process, the applicant is required to give notice to the Chief Officer of Police and the Home Office where an application to transfer a premises licence has been made under section 42 of the Act and to the Chief Officer of Police where an application to vary the DPS has been made under section 37 of the Act.
- 5.2 Under the Act, where a Chief Officer of Police is satisfied that the exceptional circumstances of the case are such that granting the applications would undermine the crime prevention objective, he must serve notice on the licensing authority and, where such a notice has been served and not withdrawn, a hearing must be held to determine the application.
- 5.3 Equally, where the Home Office is satisfied that the exceptional circumstances of the case are such that granting the application would be prejudicial to the prevention of illegal working in licensed premises, they must serve notice on the licensing authority and a hearing must be held to determine the application.
- 5.4 The application to Transfer the Premises Licence Holder was submitted on 8 June 2025 and was sent to the responsible authorities (which are the Police and Home Office) on the same day. There is a 14 day representation period which expired on the 22 June 2025.
- 5.5 The application to Vary the Designated Premises Supervisor was submitted on the 10 June 2025 and was sent to the responsible authorities (which are the Police and Home Office) on the same day. There is a 14 days representation period which expired on the 24 June 2025.
- 5.6 During the 14 days representation period, the Licensing Authority received a relevant objection from one of the Responsible Authorities, namely Cheshire Police to both applications (transfer of Premises Licence Holder and Vary Designated Premises Supervisor).
- 5.7 As stated above, where relevant representations have been made and not withdrawn, the licensing authority must hold a hearing to consider them (unless otherwise agreed by the parties).
- 5.8 The hearing is held in accordance with the Act and the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005. The procedure to be followed has been circulated to all parties and will be repeated at the beginning of the hearing.

- 5.9 The hearing is solely concerned with those aspects of the application, which has been the subject of the relevant representations as defined in the Act. These are the representations made by Cheshire Police.
- 5.10 At the time of writing this report I have not received any indication from the Cheshire Police, if they will be making any submissions to the Sub-Committee at the hearing. All parties have all been informed of the hearing.

6. THE REPRESENTATIONS

6.1 **RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES**

Relevant representations have been received from Cheshire Police.

Attached at **Appendix D** is a copy of the objection to the transfer of the Premises Licence. The objection is on the ground that it would undermine the licensing objectives on the prevention of crime and disorder.

Attached at **Appendix E** is a copy of the objection to the Vary of Designated Premises Supervisor. The objection is on the ground that it would undermine the licensing objectives on the prevention of crime and disorder.

7. OPTIONS

- 7.1 The Sub-Committee has the following options under Section 44 of the Act,
 - (1) Grant the application to transfer the premises licence,
 - (2) Reject the application to transfer the premises licence if it considers it appropriate for the promotion of the crime prevention objective,

The Sub-Committee has the following options under Section 39 of the Act;

- (1) Grant the application to vary the designated premises supervisor,
- (2) Reject the application to vary the designated premises supervisor if it considers it appropriate for the promotion of the crime prevention objective.

Recorded CCTV images will be maintained and stored for a period of twenty-eight days,

A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show/provide footage to a Police officer or an authorised officer of the licensing authority data or footage upon request.

Designated supervisors will need to demonstrate that their CCTV system complies with their Operational requirements. They will need to be able to demonstrate the following:-

- Recordings are fit for their intended purpose,
- Good quality images are presented to the officer in a format that can be replayed on a standard computer
- The supervisor has an understanding of the equipment/training,
- Management records are kept,
- Maintenance agreements and records are maintained,
- Data Protection principles and signage are in place.

The applicant has not offered any age verification scheme, so in order to enhance the conditions already offered under the protection of children from harm, the following conditions are to apply:

Protection of Children from Harm

A "Challenge 25" policy shall be operated at the premises at all times.

The only forms of ID that shall be accepted (at the discretion of the Management) as proof of age are a valid passport, a valid photographic driving licence, a PASS approved proof of age card, HM Services Warrant Card or other reliable photo ID (that has been approved for acceptance by the Police or an Officer of the Local Authority)

Publicity materials notifying customers of the operation of the "Challenge 25" scheme shall be displayed at the premises.

The Designated Premises Supervisor or Premises Licence Holder shall operate and maintain an up-todate Register of Refusals of Sale of Alcohol, indicating the date, time and reason for refusal which shall be made available for inspection by Local Authority Officers and the Police.

The DPS or other responsible person shall check and sign the register once a week.

Alternatively an electronic point of sale refusals log shall be kept.

A documented training programme shall be introduced for all staff in a position to sell, serve or deliver alcohol. A written record for each member of staff shall be kept of the content of such training and shall be made available for inspection at the request of Local Authority Officers and Police.

The DPS or Premises Licence Holder shall conduct six monthly training reviews with all members of staff authorised to sell, serve or deliver alcohol in order to reinforce the training and to promote best practice. A written record for each member of staff shall be kept of the content of such reviews and shall be made available for inspection at the request of Local Authority Officers and Police.

A list of persons authorised to sell alcohol shall be kept on site and made available for inspection at the

request of Local Authority Officers and Police.

Clearly visible signage is to be displayed at the entrances and at points of sale indicating it is illegal to sell alcohol to people under the age of 18.

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D Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

D - Display of Licence

D1 The Summary Licence or a certified copy of that summary must be prominently displayed at the premises whenever the premises are being used for one or more licensable activities authorised by the licence.

D2 A notice specifying the position held at the premises by any person nominated for the purposes S 57 (2) of the LA 2003 (which relates to the keeping at the premises of the premises licence or a certified copy of it) must be prominently displayed at the premises whenever the premises are being used for one or more licensable activities authorised by the licence.

D3 Whenever the premises are being used for one or more licensable activities authorised by the licence a constable or an authorised officer may require any person referred to in D2 as the person nominated for the purposes of S 57 (2) L A 2003 to produce the premises licence or a certified copy of it.

E Mandatory Conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

2. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2)In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities or substantially similar activities carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply

alcohol) or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible(whether within a time limit or otherwise)

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carried a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carried a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in, the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage, or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner:

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

3. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) the policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request before being served alcohol identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-

- (a) A holographic mark, or
- (b) An ultraviolet feature

5. The responsible person must ensure that-

- (a) Where any of the following alcoholic drink is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) is available to customers in the following measure-
 - (i) Beer or cider, ½ pint
 - (ii) Gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml, and
 - (iii) Still wine in a glass: 125ml

- (b) These measures are displayed in a menu price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises, and
- (c) Where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

6. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.



On behalf of Cheshire Police, I wish to record an objection to the application to transfer the premises licence for the premises known as the Blundell Arms, Hale Road, Widnes, WA8 8SX.

The transfer application is seeking to transfer the licence from the landlord Mr Navin Soni's company Cheshire Retail NW Ltd to Lorraine ASHTON.

Mr Soni has spoken to HBC Licensing Enforcement officer Craig Ward and stated that Ms ASHTON is not named on the lease for the premises, the lease is in a company name Mollies Bar Ltd, which has 2 directors Mr Steven Hewitt and Mr Ben Longman.

Mr Hewitt has previously made an application to transfer the premises into his name on 10/06/2025 and due to the lack of compliance and poor management of the premises an objection was made by Cheshire Police and the application was later withdrawn.

I believe that this transfer of the licence to Ms Ashton is an attempt to circumvent the action plan that has recently been agreed with Mr Hewitt to attempt to bring the premises into compliance. Following this application Mr Ward made Ms Ashton aware of the action plan and that it still applied even if the transfer was granted, and it would become her responsibility. Mr Hewitt contacted Mr Ward following this saying that he was no longer involved with the premises, and he didn't see why the action plan would still apply. As per the tenancy agreement I would argue that Mr Hewitt is still very much involved in the operation of the business.

It is also worth noting that police officers attended the premises on 07/06/2025 at 19:56 there were approx. 10 customers at the premises and one male was subject to a Section 23 Stop Search, although nothing was found. All toilets tested positive for cocaine use.

There was no personal licence holder on duty at the time of the visit, which is a requirement of the premises licence, which both Mr Hewitt and Mr Longman have been made aware of.

The Constabulary would therefore ask the licensing committee to refuse this transfer application.

The chief officer of police is satisfied that the exceptional circumstances of the case are such that granting the application to vary the designated premises supervisor would undermine the crime prevention objective.

The broad grounds for such an objection are inter-alia: -

Cheshire Police would like to object to the application to vary the DPS in respect of the above premises.

The grounds for the objection are that the applicant is unsuitable.

I was made aware that Ms Ashton was a duty manager at the premises during a compliance visit on 02/04/2025, although she was not present at the time of the visit. The premises has been non-compliant with the terms of the premises licence for over 12 months and an action plan has recently been agreed with the current DPS Mr Steven Hewitt to try and bring this premises into compliance.

Police officers attended the premises as part of a routine licensing check on 07/06/2025 at 19:56 there were approx. 10 customers at the premises and one male was subject to a Section 23 Stop Search, although nothing was found. All toilets tested positive for cocaine use.

There was no personal licence holder on duty at the time of the visit, which is a requirement of the premises licence, which both Mr Hewitt and Mr Longman have been made aware of.

I believe that this DPS variation to Ms Ashton is an attempt to circumvent the action plan that has recently been agreed with Mr Hewitt to attempt to bring the premises into compliance. Following this application Mr

Ward the council's licensing enforcement officer made Ms Ashton aware of the action plan and that it still applied, and it would become her responsibility to meet the requirements set out in the action plan. Mr Hewitt contacted Mr Ward he was unhappy and claiming that he was no longer involved with the running of the premises, and he didn't see why the action plan would still apply.			
Ms Ashton is not named on the tenancy for the premises and is just a manager employed by Mr Hewitt and Mr Longman and I would argue that Mr Hewitt is still very much involved in the running of the premises, and I believe that Ms Ashton would just be the name on the licence with little or no involvement in the day to day operation of the business.			
It is the considered view of the Chief Officer of Police that the likely effect of this variation of DPS on the promotion of the licensing objectives would be adverse and it would undermine the Crime and Disorder licensing objective.
