On behalf of Cheshire Police, I am writing to support the review of the premises licence in respect of the premises known as Today's Extra, 76 Albert Road, Widnes, WA8 6JT.

Officers from Cheshire Constabulary were present during the visit on Friday 18th July 2025 as they were conducting a licensing compliance visit whilst home office immigration enforcement officers carried out their checks on the workers present and working at the premises.

Officers entered the premises under Section 179 of the licensing act 2003 which grants police and authorised persons to enter the premises to investigate licensable activities and potential offences under the act.

There were a number of compliance concerns identified during the visit all of which would constitute a Section 136 offences under the licensing act 2003, which also undermine the licensing objective of prevention of crime and disorder.

Conditions attached to a premises licence dictate how the premises can operate and as such they are legally binding.

The definition of a Section 136 offence under the licensing act 2003:

It is an offence to carry on or attempt to carry on a licensable activity on or from any premises other than under and in accordance with an authorisation. A person guilty of this offence is liable to be imprisoned for up to 6 months and/or an unlimited fine.

During the visit police officers spoke to the DPS Dinesh FERNANDO to request the password for the CCTV to allow them to review the footage to assist with immigration enforcement investigation. The DPS was obstructive and would/could not provide the password to allow the police officer to view the footage. Under Section 179 of the licensing act, it is an offence to intentionally obstruct a police officer or an authorised person from exercising their powers.

The Licensing Act 2003 sets out the licensing regime for the sale and supply of alcohol, the provision of entertainment and the provision of late-night refreshment in England & Wales. Section 36 of the act and Schedule 4 to the Immigration Act 2016 amends the 2003 Act and introduces immigration safeguards in respect of licensing applications made in England or Wales on or after the 6 April 2017. The intention is to prevent illegal working in premises licensed for the sale of alcohol or late-night refreshment.

The statutory prevention of crime objective in the 2003 Act includes the prevention of immigration crime and the prevention of illegal working in licensed premises.

There are further concerns regarding the workers who have been found to be working at the premises unlawfully as they have been paid below the minimum wage for staff employed in the United Kingdom and they have been paid in cash, so it is suspected that no tax or national insurance has been paid with regards to these people, who are potential victims of modern day slavery offences.

Given the number of illegal workers found to be working at the premises over the last 17 months and the breaches of the conditions on the premises licence and Mr Fernando's obstruction of officers from the police and immigration in their investigation of the offences relating to illegal workers this demonstrates a complete and utter disregard for any of the laws that Mr Fernando is bound by and it is therefore the view of the constabulary that this undermines the licensing objective of prevention of crime and disorder.

The Constabulary therefore supports the Home Office Immigration review application which seeks revocation of the premises licence.

We would concur that this is the only option to effectively deal with the issues identified as the addition of any new conditions on the licence would likely have little or no effect on how the business is operated due to the blatant disregard the premises licence holder and DPS has

already demonstrated for the various pieces of legislation that they are bound by when operating a licensed premises (Licensing Act 2003) and the lawful employment of staff.

I am the above named officer and I am stationed at WARRINGTON POLICE STATION. I currently work on the Warrington Licensing Team and I am making this statement in relation to TODAY'S EXTRA, ALBERT ROAD, WIDNES, WA86JT.

At approximately 12:15 hours on FRIDAY 18th JULY 2025 I attended TODAY'S EXTRA with Police Licensing Officer Lesley HALLIDAY in order to complete a licensing compliance visit. We also attended with Halton Borough Council and Immigration Enforcement Officers who were completing immigration checks.

On entering TODAY'S EXTRA we located three staff members. Immigration Officers completed relevant checks on the persons present and identified that staff member [REDACTED] was working behind the counter serving customers, which was in breach of her visa conditions. Immigration officers spoke to [REDACTED] in a private setting in the rear of store, where the stock was held. I was present during the interaction between Immigration Officers and [REDACTED]. Throughout the conversation it was clear that [REDACTED] was changing her answers or failing to answer questions.

In order to assist the Immigration Officers in identifying how long [REDACTED] had worked at TODAY'S EXTRA, I went to the counter and asked the serving staff member if I could view their CCTV. I would describe this staff member as White British female, average height and

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approximatley late 50's. This staff member explained that she did not know how to work the CCTV system in the store and she did not have access to this CCTV system but showed me a tablet device where I would be able to view CCTV if I could gain access. This staff member also explained that no one that was currently in the store could work or gain access to the CCTV system. I was informed the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) had access to the CCTV but he was not currently in the store.

Within the Premises Licence issued by HALTON BOROUGH COUNCIL for TODAY'S EXTRA it states 'A CCTV camera system capable of providing evidential quality images in all lighting conditions shall be used covering the interior and the immediate exterior (entrance) of the shop. Images will be retained for a period of at least 28 days and be made available to the Police upon request within a reasonable time period'. It goes on to state 'The CCTV recording equipment shall be kept in a secure environment under the control of the premises licence holder (PLH) and/or another named responsible individual'. Failure to comply with such conditions would be a breach of TODAY'S EXTRA'S Premises Licence.

I re-entered the rear of the store and an immigration officer was on the phone to DPS Dinesh FERNANDO. I took the phone from the officer and spoke to FERNANDO. I identified myself as a police officer and explained why I was speaking to him. I asked FERNANDO for the password to the CCTV. I explained the urgency and importance of what I believed was a reasonable request. FERNANDO was extremely defensive from the outset of our conversation and explained he could either not remember the password or did not know this. Again, I explained the urgency of this request and FERNANDO failed to assist with this. FERNANDO explained I needed to go upstairs where the hardrive was to access CCTV as he did not know the password to the tablet device. On entering a small room upstairs in TODAY'S EXTRA there was a large hardrive in the corner of the room with wires surrounding it. Despite this, there were no screens, no mouse or keyboard to view any CCTV footage. There was no reasonable way to access the CCTV footage in this room. FERNANDO had failed to provide me with CCTV upon my request and had been extremely defensive and difficult when asked simple questions. I believe

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FERNANDO was actively obstructing a constable from carrying out their duty.

Fortunately, on returning downstairs my colleague from Halton Borough Council had gained access to the live CCTV in the shop using the tablet device. He did this without the assistance of FERNANDO or any other staff member.

Ultimately there are four licensing objectives which underpin the Act, and which need to be taken into account and promoted throughout the licensing process.

The licensing objectives are:

- the prevention of crime and disorder
- public safety
- the prevention of public nuisance and
- the protection of children from harm

On FRIDAY 18TH JULY 2025 TODAY'S EXTRA was found employing illegal workers, ultimately failing to meet the prevention of crime and disorder and public safety objectives. Along with this DPS FERNANDO showed a blatant disregard to requests asked of him by a serving police constable. The four licensing objectives are detailed on the Premises Licence issued by HALTON BOROUGH COUNCIL and DPS FERNANDO has a responsibility to uphold these licensing objectives.

Due to the above, I support Immigration Enforcements application for the review of the premises TODAY'S EXTRA, ALBERT ROAD, WIDENS, WA86JT.

The premises is situated on a main road (Albert Road) within Widnes Town Centre which has a number of licensed premises, including off-licences, speciality shops, late night refreshment premises and a number of public houses and bars. The premises is also situated close to [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] provides housing related support for adults (including young adults 16 & 17 years old) who are homeless or at a risk of homelessness. It accommodates upto 39 people and offers targeted support for people with a wide range of needs including learning disabilities and/or

autistic spectrum conditions, people with substance misuse and people with a history of offending. It provides short term focussed support to support its residents to find sustainable long term accommodation within the local community.

Today's Extra was first granted a premises licence in January 2021 the application describes the premises as a modern and professional general convenience store, stating that the applicant would like to offer alcohol sales to allow the business to offer the complete all-round general convenience service. The focus of the shop will be as a general convenience store with the proposed alcohol sales just being a part of the overall business.

At the time of the application the premises licence holder was Red Cherry Retail Ltd - Registered No: 09119784 Registered to 80 White Lion Road, Amersham, Bucks, HP7 9JS. Checks on companies house showed that the company was incorporated on the 7th July 2014 and it had 1 director and person with significant control named [REDACTED], B. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] resigned on the 1st January 2024 and Mr Dinesh FERNANDO, B. [REDACTED] was appointed as director and person with significant control.

On 4th June 2025 an application form was received to transfer the premises licence, the transfer was to a company called Diamond 8 Retail Ltd - Registered No: 15732849 Registered to [REDACTED]

Checks on companies house showed that this company was incorporated on 21st May 2024 and it has 1 director and person with significant control [REDACTED] FERNANDO, [REDACTED]. It was also noted that Dinesh FERNANDO was named on the company as a director until 19th June 2024.

Mr Dinesh FERNANDO is the designated premises supervisor and it is noted that the companies registered address is the same as Mr FERNANDO's home address.

I visited the premises on Friday 18th July as part of a multi-agency visit in the company of Craig

Ward Halton Borough Council Licensing Enforcement officer and Home Office Immigration Enforcement Officers to carry out a licensing compliance check and Immigration were conducting checks on the persons employed and working at the premises to ensure that they have the appropriate authority to work in the UK.

At the time of the visit on the 18th July 2025 Mr FERNANDO was not present at the premises. I went through the licensing questions with a shop assistant who identified herself to me as [REDACTED]

The premises licence summary was on display and a copy of the full licence was available for inspection. I was told that there were 3 members of staff on duty at the time of the visit.

[REDACTED] advised that there was a CCTV system in operation at the premises, they have a digital system with approximately 20 camera's, she was unaware of the retention period for the footage stating that its 3-4 weeks, but she didn't know exactly. The only person with full access to the CCTV is the Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor.

[REDACTED] advised that staff had been trained on Challenge 25 however the training was not documented or signed by staff and no documented training records were available at the premises for inspection. [REDACTED] claimed that refresher training had taken place within the last month but there was nothing available to evidence this.

The premises licence has a condition which states:

"A staff training scheme shall be used for all staff authorised to sell alcohol. The training will cover the importance of preventing under age sales and complying with licence conditions. Refresher training will be provided every 12 months, records will be kept and be made available to responsible authorities."

I asked [REDACTED] If there was a written authority to sell in place and she looked very blankly, so I described what information would be on a written authority to sell and she advised that she wasn't

aware of one.

The premises licence has a condition which states:

"All staff selling alcohol shall be authorised to sell alcohol in writing and a record of the authorisation will be kept in the shop for inspection."

The shop operated a refusals register and this was available for inspection with the last documented refusal being 14/06/2025, however not all entries were being completed correctly as there was at least 1 entry that was undated.

The premises licence requires that the shop have a refusals policy and this should be on display within the premises along with Crimestoppers promotional material to be on display to promote the initiative I do not recall seeing any such policy or promotional material at the premise during the visit.

The premises operate an incident log book, however the last entry in it was from 2022.

██████ confirmed that they were aware of the condition relating to deliveries to the premises and that all of these took place after 10am during the day so as not to cause public nuisance to local residents.

The premises licence requires notices to be on display in the premises asking for customers to leave the premises quietly, I do not recall seeing any such notices displayed at the premises.

The premises licence also has a condition that reads "Staff will monitor the area immediately outside the premises on a regular basis to check for, and to properly dispose of, any litter from the premises." There was litter outside of the premises in the form of empty vape cartons and food wrappers, so there was no evidence to suggest that this condition was being complied with.

There were a number of breaches of the premises licence specifically around the lack of

documented staff training and written authority to sell and a number of signs and policies that should be on display at the premises, these are all Section 136 offences under the licensing act 2003 and on summary conviction carry the penalty of a unlimited fine and/or upto 6 months in prison.

These licence breaches undermine the licensing objective of prevention of crime and disorder. A copy of the form completed as part of the compliance checks is exhibited as LH1.

I was shocked by the size of the premises, as given the description on the licence I expected a corner shop or small convenience store, this premises is more like an independent supermarket and the alcohol offering is vast and far greater than I would expect of a local convenience store. It included the draught beer machines and the kegs to use with them, there was also a magnum of Belvedere vodka (approx 1.50-1.75 litres) on sale, which is not your average offering. I refer to photo's exhibited as LH2.

The store does create some demand on the local police service mainly for shoplifting offences and anti-social behaviour. There have been approx 11 incidents recorded up to 31/08/2025 for 2025 and 19 incidents recorded throughout 2024 - refer exhibit LH 3 for a summary of the incidents.

I asked Mr Fernando if the premises licence was available for inspection and he was able to

produce it and the summary was on display.

Mr Fernando provided a booklet that had been put in place, it contained a due diligence checklist of things to check at the premises, this was signed by Mr Fernando and dated 27th July 2025, then it had a Written Authority to Sell which Mr Fernando had signed on 17th August 2025 and the staff had signed on 19th August 2025 which it was noted was the day before the Home Office submitted the application for review of the licence.

There was indepth information for staff to read as part of their training and an age verification policy had been put in place, however this was signed by Mr Fernando on 17th August 2025 but none of the staff had signed it.

There was a refusal register in place and staff had started to use this again since the visit on 17th July 2025 and entries were seen from the beginning of August 2025.

Part of the licence condition regarding refusal of service requires "A notice advising customers of the refusal policy shall be on display. 'Crimestoppers' promotional material will be on display to support the initiative"

No evidence of the refusal policy or Crimestoppers information was seen on display.

The licence has a condition that states "Any incidents of crime and disorder at or immediately outside the premises, witnessed by staff, will be recorded in an incident book kept at the premises. This book will be kept in the shop and available for inspection"

There was an incident book in place however the last entry was made in 2022. I would expect this to contain any incidents that have occurred at the premises and in particular incidents of shoplifting which I can see from police records there have been a number of incidents reported in 2024 and 2025 and none of them are documented in the incident book.

I asked Mr Fernando about his CCTV and he advised that the retention period is more than 30 days, there is an iPad which is kept by the till where the staff can show officers any footage, however the only person with access to download and provide the footage to the police or other responsible authorities is Mr Fernando.

The premises licence conditions require that "Notices shall be on display in the premises asking customers to leave the premises quietly."

Initially the notice could not be located, it was stuck in the window but it was facing the outside of the store rather than inside where customers approaching the door were able to read it. I left Mr Fernando some more prominent posters requesting customers to leave quietly to assist with compliance of this condition.

When we arrived at the premises there was a male sat outside the premises, he was sat on top of a holdall, he was still there when we left and there was also a female sat outside the premises on the opposite side to the male.

Exhibit LH 4 evidences the booklet viewed during the visit and pictures of the male and female sat outside the premises.

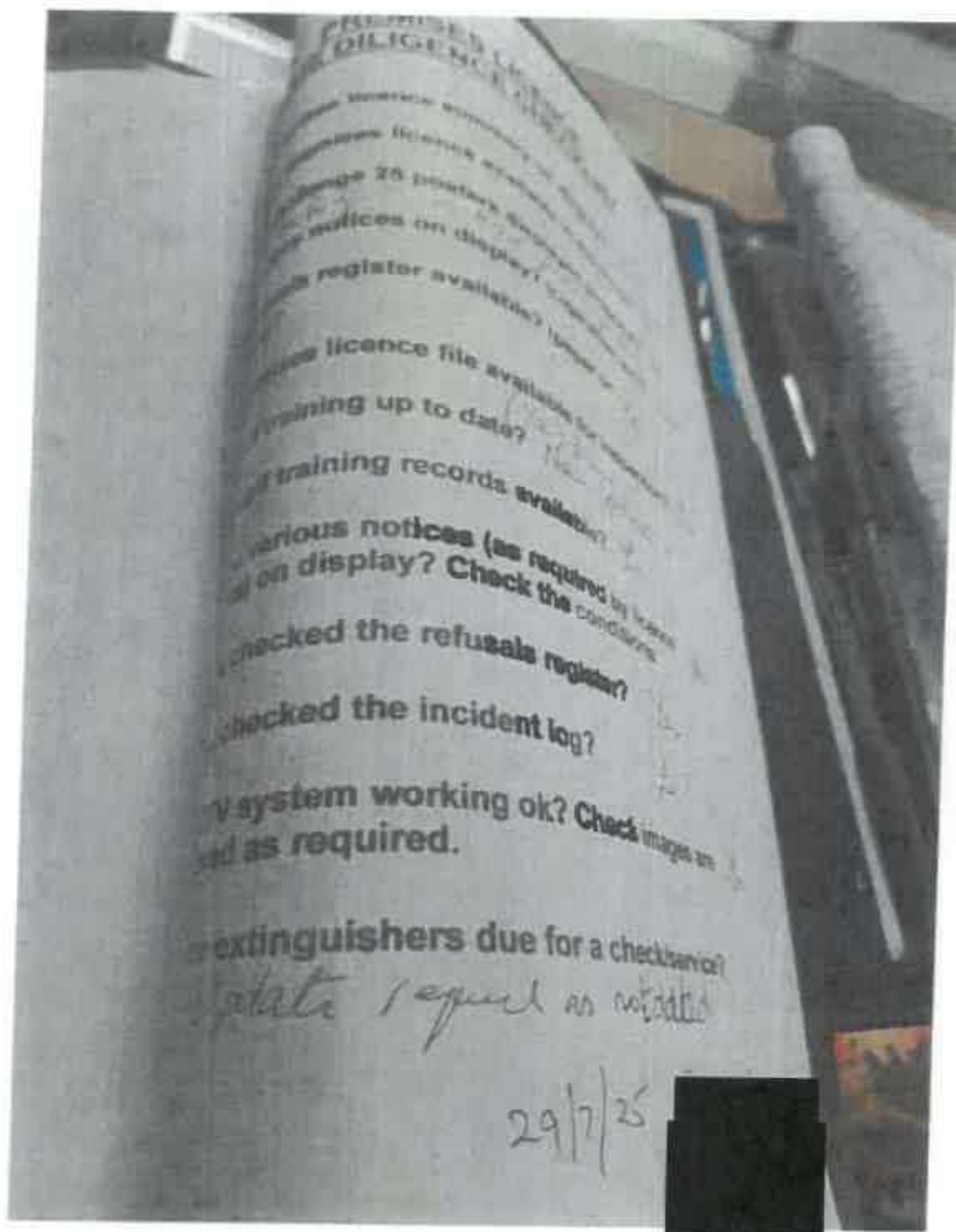

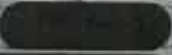
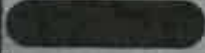
